**Treasurer Report, Dave Hartsook:** Treasurer had an excused absence at this meeting. Treasurer reports are presented to members via The Night Sky Newsletter. There were no additions or corrections to the two reports.

**New Business:** Cathy read the ACA mission statement to as a reminder to everyone. She invited membership input to help the Board fulfill the mission.

Cathy announced the membership will have an opportunity to vote to change the bylaws at the November meeting to permit the ACA Lifetime Members to serve on the Board.

Observatory Director Report, Ron Kalinoski: There is a need for a maintenance day at the observatory in October. Ron reported that there was an inventory of all the materials/boards need to replace the wooden supports under the rail in the roof roll off and to restore the paneling of the west side of the observatory.

Statutory agent, Mark Kochheiser, informed Ron about a proposed new visitor center at the Portage Lakes State Park's beach access area near to the observatory. Ron contacted our area's state representative, Jack Daniels, to request concept sketches about the proposed visitor center. The intent is that the ACA can be in the loop as to the design and have input on ways to minimize impacts on observatory viewing.

There were lots of solar parties in the summer. Now that the school year has resumed, there will be fewer, primarily scheduled for weekends. There was a reminder also to watch for announcements about star parties.

**Member observations:** Stuart Clary reported enjoying good views of Venus.

Dean Phillips commented on how views of Saturn have been great the last two months.

Member inquiry: Inquiry about any plans to ask the State Park to trim/cut any trees for better observations. There was discussion that in the past there was a chestnut tree removed to the west of the observatory. General discussion was that there is not a need for a request to remove trees at the present.

### **STAR PARTIES:** Portage Lakes State Park Observatory featuring a computerized 16 inch telescope

- Please join us for stargazing and educational activities. Our Star Parties are free and open to the public Please arrive on time to avoid headlight distraction.
- For notice of "impromptu star parties", send e-mail to ACAstarparty@att.net to request e-mail notification of our observing sessions.
- Events will be cancelled if skies are cloudy. Always check website for star party status two hours before event.
- This is an outdoor activity in an unheated environment. Nighttime temperatures drop rapidly, even during summer. A general rule of thumb is to dress for 15 degrees cooler than predicted nighttime low temperature.
- Please, <u>No Smoking</u> on observatory grounds. Smoke reacts with optical surfaces, damaging optical coatings.
- Please, no use of cell phones or tablets in observatory (to preserve night vision).
