Next ACA Monthly Meeting Scheduled for SATURDAY, October 14, 2023

Please note that ACA's next membership meeting is scheduled for Saturday, October 14th at 2:00 pm. This deviation from our normal Sunday meeting date is due to our speaker's preference since he is traveling from Columbus to present to us. Also, weather permitting, observatory director Ron Kalinoski plans to set up on site a telescope with appropriate filters for members to view the annular solar eclipse.

This month's speaker is OSU Professor Don Terndrup. Professor Terndrup is an observational astronomer focused on the characterization of stars and stellar systems, with a n e m p h a s is on the ir abundances and rotation rates. He is known for his work on the structure and stellar population of the Galactic bulge, the angular momentum of low-mass stars, the distances to open clusters, and the structure of spiral galaxies. His recent work focuses on the physics of quasar winds and their impact on galaxy evolution. Professor Terndrup joined the Ohio State faculty in 1990 and he also served as the Program Director in the Division of Astronomical Sciences at the National Science Foundation from 2008 to 2012. Currently, he is serving as the co-chair of Graduate Admissions for the Department of Astronomy. His presentation entitled "What Can Be Expected When We Find Life On Other Planets?" promises to be intriguing. Please join us for this special event! 

Observatory Report

For September, we had star parties on the 1st, 15th, and 30th. Each star party had very good public turnout with standing room only in the observatory, as Saturn was the featured celestial object for each event. Many telescopes were set up on the observatory grounds, including youngsters setting up our 8-inch Dobsonian. On the 15th and 30th, we set up the 5-inch refractor to view Saturn, the Coathanger star cluster, and the Moon. On September 30th, the Moon was one day past Full. We usually don't view the Moon in this phase, however, there was some interesting craters to see. Russell and Schickard craters are partially filled with lava, giving a beautiful contrast in surface detail within the crater. Thanks to Dave Hartsook and Niladri Kar for set up and operation of the 5inch refractor.

On September 25th, we had a very successful maintenance day at the observatory. We worked

for five hours and completed everything on the maintenance list. The observatory and grounds look beautiful. Thanks to Ed Kotapish, Stuart Clary, and Amy & Gary Ciesielczyk for getting our observatory looking so good! Here is a list of what we accomplished:

- 1. Clean Observatory
- 2. Repair Double Door Threshold
- 3. Fill sidewalk gaps at double door and main entrance with pea gravel.
- 4. Pull weeds
- 5. Fix molding on southwest part of observatory building.
- 6. Repair T-111 paneling.
- 7. Repair Roof latches.
- 8. Stain baseboard east side of observatory building.
- 9. Stain southwest corner of privy.
- 10. Stain top of roof roll-off structure.


