Blast From Junes Past

Here's a blast from Junes past. On June 5th, 2012, Venus transited the Sun. Long time ACA member, Dave Jessie, led a Venus transit party at Fishcreek Elementary School in Stow, Ohio. The weather was overcast and occasional light rain plagued us all day. To make things worse, the Sun lowering in the sky would soon be blocked by trees on the western horizon of our viewing site. At a little before 7 PM EDT, the clouds broke up a little bit and we were finally able to see the transit, already in progress, as the clouds continued to thicken and thin. Dozens of people politely lined up at the available telescopes and viewed the transit for just a few seconds each. They then quickly stepped aside for the next hopeful observer. This went on for 15 or 20 minutes until thickening clouds and trees on the horizon ended viewing at our location.

Some of us were lucky enough to see the June 8th, 2004 transit as well. Before that, the most recent Venus transit occurred on December 6th, 1882. The next transit won't occur until December 10th, 2117. Because of our unique love of astronomy, we who witnessed either transit are the lucky few. Our next chance will be a tad more than 94 years from now.
