Observatory Report

A proposed 2026 Observatory Budget was submitted to the ACA Board on December 20th and approved on January 2nd. The 2026 Observatory Budget has been submitted for printing in the January newsletter. The 2026 Winter/Spring Activity Schedule is complete, circulated, and submitted for printing in the January newsletter. Thanks to Diwakar for circulating the activity schedule and Earl for updating our website with the new schedule. We have some exciting talks coming up this year for our members and the public at large.

Niladri Kar has been helping Astronomy Club of Akron by continuing our World-Famous Moon

Calendar featured on our website. The data source for the previous calendars made by Dave Jessie from 2009 to 2024 is no longer available. Niladri has written a program to collect NASA data and create the Moon Calendar for 2025 and 2026. Niladri's work maintains the same appearance as calendars produced by Dave Jessie; however, uses a different data source and a computer program written by Niladri to generate those calendars. Here is a brief explanation of what the Niladri program does: The program is written in python. First, it collects all moon images for designated year, month, time of the day, latitude and longitude from NASA Moon Phase and Libration page. Then it calculates the date and time of major phases (new, first quarter, full and last quarter) from ephemeral data. Finally, the script makes monthly calendar, fills each shell with day of the month, moon image, major phase, if applicable, and saves each month in HTML format.

- Please join us for stargazing and educational activities. Our Star Parties are free and open to the public. Please arrive on time to avoid headlight distraction.
- For notice of “impromptu star parties”, send e-mail to ACAstarparty@att.net to request e-mail notification of our observing sessions.
- Events will be cancelled if skies are cloudy. Always check website for star party status two hours before event.
- This is an outdoor activity in an unheated environment. A general rule of thumb is to dress for 15 degrees cooler than predicted nighttime low temperature.
- Please, No Smoking on observatory grounds. Smoke reacts with optical surfaces, damaging optical coatings.
- Please, no use of cell phones or tablets in observatory (to preserve night vision).
